

During her studies, Dominie volunteered as a student adviser at the Queen Mary Legal Advice Centre, represented appellants in welfare benefit tribunal hearings, and delivered advocacy workshops as a mentor on the Griffin LAW pro bono initiative run by Gray's Inn.

Prior to joining Chambers, Dominie worked as a Teaching Fellow at SOAS University of London, and interned at the law reform charity JUSTICE.
